100	Our current Prime Minister was born right here in Ottawa. What is his name? <i>Justin Trudeau</i>	This city is the capital of Canada, and its name comes from the Algonquin word “adawe” that means “to trade.” <i>Ottawa</i>	The shield on the Coat of Arms of Ottawa has several wavy blue lines on it, representing the Ottawa, Rideau, and Gatineau – which are what? <i>Rivers</i>	This flag has our national symbol on it, along with two red bars that represent the oceans on our east and west coasts. <i>Flag of Canada</i>	This famous building in downtown Ottawa was destroyed by a fire in 1916, and rebuilt by 1922; it is now closed for ten to fifteen years for major renovations. <i>Parliament Buildings (centre block)</i>
200	Patrick Chan was born in Ottawa and recently won a gold medal at the Winter Olympics for what sport? <i>Figure Skating</i>	This name for part of the west end of Ottawa is the Huron word for “village” and is likely the same word that inspired the name of our country. <i>Kanata</i>	The Ontario Coat of Arms features a black bear, a deer, and this animal who is also on the back of a quarter. <i>Moose</i>	You’ll see this flag flying at City Hall and at most Community Centers. <i>Flag of Ottawa</i>	Ottawa was originally called Bytown after Colonel John By, an engineer who built what major waterway that we skate on in the winter? <i>Rideau Canal</i>
300	This singer of the songs “Love Yourself,” “What Do You Mean,” and “Sorry” is from London, Ontario, and got a lot of attention when he wandered around the Market in downtown Ottawa in 2016. <i>Justin Bieber</i>	A main feature in downtown Ottawa is the Rideau Falls. What does “Rideau” mean? <i>Curtain</i>	The Coat of Arms of Canada is supported by two animals: a lion, representing England, and this kind of magical, imaginary creature, representing Scotland. <i>Unicorn</i>	You’ll see this flag flying over our province’s government buildings in our provincial capital, Toronto. <i>Flag of Ontario</i>	This local museum – on the Gatineau side of the river – is the most visited museum in Canada. <i>The Museum of History</i>
400	Alex Trebek was born in Sudbury and went to university in Ottawa. What TV game show does he host? <i>Jeopardy</i>	This French name for part of the east end of Ottawa was chosen by the first postmaster in the area, after his place of birth, an island near Quebec City. <i>Orleans</i>	On one side of the Ottawa Coat of Arms is a Timber Trimmer – a man who had a job in this industry, which was very important to early Ottawa. <i>Forestry</i>	You might see this flag flying downtown on holidays that celebrate French Culture in Ontario. <i>Franco-Ontarien Flag</i>	Although Toronto and Quebec City each served as the capital, Ottawa was officially made the capital city by what year, the year of confederation? <i>1867</i>

500	<p>Born in Brantford, Ontario, and considered the Greatest hockey player of all time, this man played his last ever hockey game in Canada against the Ottawa Senators in 1999.</p> <p><i>Wayne Gretzky</i></p>	<p>Both the Prime Minister's residence and Rideau Hall, the Governor-General's residence, are on this famous downtown street, named for a British duke.</p> <p><i>Sussex</i></p>	<p>The Coat of Arms of Canada contains our national motto in Latin – "A Mari Usque a Mare". What does this mean in English?</p> <p><i>From sea to sea</i></p>	<p>This flag can be found flying at Rideau Hall in downtown Ottawa, which is the official home of the Queen's representative in Canada.</p> <p><i>Flag of the Governor-General</i></p>	<p>The land where Ottawa sits was originally settled by this Indigenous tribe, and no treaty was ever signed with them</p> <p><i>Algonquin</i></p>
